

The Chartered Manager Degree Apprenticeship

Now available for professional managers to study in Basingstoke.



We're working in partnership with Southampton Solent University to offer the Chartered Manager Degree Apprenticeship (CMDA) in Basingstoke.

If you live in or around Basingstoke, you can now build your professional management career with Basingstoke College of Technology (BCoT), which means you don't have to travel far and it's easier to fit around your work commitments.



What is a CMDA?

It's a flexible management apprenticeship programme that provides a degree level qualification, a Level 5 Diploma and the opportunity to earn Chartered Manager status, accredited by the Chartered Management Institute (CMI).

The CMDA also provides research and learning for the ever-changing world of business and allows you to apply theoretical models to real-life case studies from your own organisation.



Who is it for?

It's aimed at existing higher-level professional managers looking to take a lead responsibility for people, projects, operations or services, and to deliver long-term organisational success. It's designed for employed managers who may have already developed practical experience but wish to develop their theoretical understanding of management skills further.



How long will it take to complete?

BCoT is offering the fast-track two-year management degree apprenticeship. Suitable candidates will be able to finish the academic elements of their apprenticeship sooner, putting them in an excellent position for career progression and further professional development.





What are the entry requirements?

The CMDA provides a degree level qualification and is underpinned by Southampton Solent University's BA (Hons) Business Management degree. It also provides the CMI Level 5 Diploma in Management and Leadership and the opportunity to earn Chartered Manager status.

Applicants are expected to be able to demonstrate aptitude, enthusiasm and prior learning in the workplace. However, applications will be considered on an individual basis and may be admitted subject to a satisfactory interview and/or portfolio.

Most candidates will have A Levels or other relevant Level 3 qualifications. It's also a requirement that upon completion of the apprentice degree that maths and English equivalent has to be demonstrated at GCSE grade 4 or above (previously grade C). Other relevant prior experience can include a HND or foundation degree.



How does it work?

As with all apprenticeships, degree apprentices will remain in paid work during their studies and as such can continue to contribute to the day-to-day operation of the business.

This is combined with a mix of classroom-based study at BCoT that is flexible and designed to fit around existing work commitments. Students are expected to attend the equivalent of up to five weekends per year (Friday to Sunday) for class based sessions.

The CMDA is just one of a number of higher education courses BCoT offers in partnership with Southampton Solent University.

It brings us another step closer to becoming the town's first fully recognised University Centre and makes us the only further education provider in Basingstoke to offer degree programmes.

What are the costs?

Apprenticeship levy paying employers

(Business pays from Digital Apprenticeship Levy Fund)

Employers will need to pay their degree apprentices a wage, contribute towards tuition costs and cover the cost of any professional body membership fees.

Non-levy paying employers

Total cost of CMDA two-year route (Fast-track)

Your business pays

Cost

£13,500 spread over two years
£1,350 over two years
(the Government pays the remaining £12,150)

The Government will contribute 90% off the total cost of the training up to a cap with the employers contributing the other 10%.
