Student Life & Our Expectations

To help your student thrive in a professional environment, we've outlined some key policies:

- Student Badges: For their safety and to access classes, it is essential that students
 wear their BCoT badges at all times. They can get one free temporary badge per
 term with a deposit. After that, a new badge must be purchased or they will be asked
 to go home to get their forgotten badge. We appreciate your support in reinforcing
 the importance of this.
- Dress Code: While some vocational areas have specific uniforms, all students are expected to wear clothing appropriate for a professional setting. This means no offensive logos, and hats should not be worn in classrooms. Hoodies must also be down inside all college buildings.
- Mobile Phones: Mobile phones are prohibited during lessons unless a teacher gives specific instructions for their use. If a student uses their phone without permission, they will be sent home for the day. Moving forward, they will need to leave their phone with their tutor at the start of every lesson for the rest of the term.
